1. Purpose of the S-NRUF

Section 9.1 of *Canadian NPA Relief Planning Guideline*, Version 7.0 dated 14 September 2018 states that:

..., a Jeopardy Condition exists when any NRUF or other CO Code assignment data indicates that the projected demand for CO Codes will exceed the quantity of CO Codes available for assignment before the date that relief is scheduled to be implemented.

In accordance with the *Canadian Numbering Resource Utilization Forecast (C-NRUF) Guideline*, Version 5.1 (the C-NRUF Guideline), approved by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) in Telecom Decision CRTC 2015-166 dated 29 April 2015:

When an NPA is declared by the CNA to be in a Jeopardy Condition, the CNA initiates a J-NRUF to obtain actual and forecast data to assist in the monitoring and management of the limited numbering resources available for assignment until relief is provided. The J-NRUF is normally conducted on a quarterly basis from the date that the Jeopardy Condition is declared by the CNA until three months of when relief is implemented.

Based on the January 2020 R-NRUF results published on 24 March 2020, the Canadian Numbering Administrator (CNA) concluded that a Jeopardy Condition existed in NPA 306/639 which covers the geographic area of Saskatchewan.

On 14 August 2020 CRTC staff directed the CNA to enforce the Jeopardy Contingency Plan (JCP) in the 306/639 Planning Document.

On 14 August 2020 CRTC staff also directed that the NPA 306/639 October 2020 J-NRUF be conducted at the NPA-level of detail, forecast at the quarterly-level for the next 4 quarters and yearly from 1 January 2022 to 1 January 2026. Subsequently, the CNA will request a J-NRUF every 3 months after the October 2020 J-NRUF (January 2021, April 2021, and July 2021) unless the October 2020 J-NRUF results indicate that the Jeopardy Condition no longer exists in NPA 306/639.

The Jeopardy Contingency Plan dictates that the CNA request two versions (two separate worksheets – Form 1 and Form 2) of the J-NRUF input from all current and prospective CO Code Holders quarterly until three (3) months before relief is provided. The forecasted quantities in Form 1 should be the same as or lower than the July 2020 S-NRUF input previously submitted. CO Code Holder forecasts may reflect an increase in demand in the period after the Relief Date. Form 2 will reflect the actual demand required by the CO Code Holder's current business plan and will be provided for information purposes only.

In accordance with CRTC staff direction provided on 14 August 2020, the CNA conducted a J-NRUF in October 2020.

The CNA has prepared this J-NRUF report in accordance with the C-NRUF Guideline.

2. High Level Summary

The CNA has rationalized the October 2020 NPA 306/639 J-NRUF input from various Telecommunications Service Providers (TSPs) and the variance from previous inputs appears reasonable.

The October 2020 NPA 306/639 J-NRUF Projected Exhaust Date (PED) has moved out to May 2022, due to business plan changes by some TSPs.

4. J-NRUF Assumptions

The assumptions used for the October 2020 NPA 306/639 J-NRUF are the assumptions that were provided on 16 October 2019 to the CNA by the Canadian

Steering Committee on Numbering (CSCN) for conducting the January 2020 NRUF.

5. Summary of Challenges Encountered During the J-NRUF Process

Most TSPs continue to rely on the CNA to remind them of the due date. The CNA started contacting companies on 8 October 2020. Despite this initiative, some S-NRUF submissions were late and incorrect.

Most CO Code Holders were confused about the difference between the Form 1 and Form 2 J-NRUF worksheets.

6. Conclusion

In accordance with Section 4, Item 6h) of the C-NRUF Guideline, the CNA has conducted assessments, sought clarification and/or explanation from various TSPs to reconcile 2020 growth with current and historical forecasts to determine whether the October 2020 J-NRUF results are reasonable.

NPA 306/639 October 2020 NPA 306/639 Form 1 (with Assignment Restrictions) PED of May 2022 and Form 2 (without Assignment Restrictions) PED of April 2022 are realistic.

NPA 306/639 has moved out of the Jeopardy Condition.
