Subject: [NPA 204 Dist] Suspension of Jeopardy in NPA 204

On September 16, 2009, the NPA 204 RPC discussed the results of the July 2009 J-NRUF for NPA 204. It was noted that the exhaust date for NPA 204 has moved outwards to October of 2016 from the April 2009 J-NRUF Projected Exhaust Date of January/March 2011 (depending on if CO Codes corresponding to Future NPAs are included), which is now at the edge of the NPA Relief Planning window. Agreement was reached at the teleconference to continue with Relief Planning for NPA 204 due to the volatility in the exhaust dates displayed over the years in NPA 204 NRUFs.

It was also noted that NPA 204 was in a jeopardy condition that was declared by the CNA on March 23, 2009 upon reviewing the results of the 2009 G-NRUF that indicated that there were less than 36 months until the projected exhaust date. Since there are now 84 months until the projected exhaust date, it was recommended and agreed that the Jeopardy Condition be lifted. Section 8.1 of the Canadian NPA Relief Planning Guideline states that: "If the CNA has declared a Jeopardy Condition, and the situation changes such that conditions...are no longer in effect, then the CNA shall suspend the Jeopardy Condition."

Therefore please consider this email as suspending the Jeopardy Condition in NPA 204.

It was also noted that on 28 May 2009, the CRTC issued Telecom Notice of Consultation CRTC 2009-309, Establishment of a CISC ad hoc committee for area code relief planning for area code 204 in Manitoba, in which it established a CRTC Interconnection Steering Committee ad hoc relief planning committee (RPC) to examine options for providing relief to area code 204 in Manitoba. The Notice of Consultation also directed the introduction of CO Code rationing measures that will be in place until 66 days before area code relief is implemented. Some discussions were held concerning this issue.

Some participants indicated that they would like to see the code rationing provisions in the Notice be lifted, since they felt that it imposed an unfair condition on some new entrants. No agreement was reached concerning this issue.
