

**NPA 819 Relief Planning Committee Conference Call  
June 2, 2010**

**Welcome and Introductions:**

Glenn Pilley welcomed the attendees and each of the participants introduced themselves. It was asked whether there were any administrative items that needed to be discussed before getting to the substance of the meeting.

**November 17, 2009 Minutes & Action Items:**

There were no substantive comments concerning the November 17, 2009 minutes and they were posted to the CNA website on December 1, 2009.

**Action Items:**

- 1) Annex F, the Distribution List, was updated after the Planning Document was finalized.

**Agenda:**

It was noted that no agenda for today's conference call had been posted on the CNA website. The objective of today's call is to review the Planning Letter which was distributed on April 22, 2010. It was noted that some comments had been received from Bell Canada on May 28, 2010.

It was noted that the Commission had released Telecom Decisions CRTC 2010-94 and CRTC 2010-94-1 on February 17 and 18, 2010 respectively. The Commission determined that relief for area code 819 is to be provided by overlaying the area served by area code 819 with new area code 873, starting on 1 June 2013.

**Planning Letter:**

Although it has not yet been posted to the CNA website, agreement was reached that the Bell Canada contribution would be accepted as the straw model document for the NPA 819 Planning Letter.

The NPA 819 Relief Planning Committee reviewed and edited the draft Planning Letter. During these activities, no detailed minute taking was undertaken.

TELUS Quebec agreed that it should have a test code in NPA 819/873 and will verify with the CNA whether they will apply for CO Code 210, 410 or 910.

**Post Meeting Note:** *TELUS Quebec has confirmed they will be using CO Code 410 in the new NPA.*

It was noted that no-one from MTS Allstream is on today's call however they had agreed to provide test codes. A member of the CNA staff will contact MTS Allstream and try to get this information before finalizing the Planning Letter.

Agreement was reached that the Planning Letter is final, as modified during today's conference call, and will be forwarded to NANPA in accordance with the Relief Implementation Plan.

**Formation of CATF & NITF:**

The Chair of the NPA 819 Relief Planning Committee called for volunteers to Co-chair the Consumer Awareness and Network Implementation Task Forces.

Doug Birdwise, Bell Canada, volunteered to be a Co-chair for the Network Implementation Task Force and Jacqueline Michelis was volunteered to become a Co-chair for the Consumer Awareness Task Force.

The CNA will send out a request for participants on each of the Task Forces.

**Next Steps:**

No further conference calls have been scheduled at this time.

The NPA 819 RPC Chair thanked the participants for attending this NPA 819 Relief Planning Committee conference call.

**Summary of Agreements Reached:**

- 1) Agreement was reached that the Bell Canada contribution would be accepted as the straw model document for the NPA 819 Planning Letter.
- 2) Agreement was reached that the Planning Letter is final, as modified during today's conference call, and will be forwarded to NANPA in accordance with the Relief Implementation Plan.

**Summary of Action Items:**

- 1) TELUS Quebec will verify with the CNA whether they will apply for CO Code 210, 410 or 910 in the new NPA for use as a test code.
- 2) A member of the CNA staff will contact MTS Allstream and try to establish which Exchange Area they are planning on using their test code before finalizing the Planning Letter.
- 3) The CNA will send out a request for participants on each of the Task Forces.
