To: **Current and Prospective Canadian Central Office (CO) Code Holders in NPAs 204, 306 & 819**

Subject: **Inputs required for April 2011 Jeopardy Numbering Resource Utilization Forecasts (J-NRUFs)**

Section 8.1 of the Canadian NPA Relief Planning Guideline (the Guideline) details the circumstances under which the Canadian Numbering Administrator (CNA) will declare a Jeopardy Condition.

As a result of the provisions contained in section 8.1, the CNA announced on 5 May 2010 that NPA 204 was in a Jeopardy Condition based on the results of the January 2010 G-NRUF. Analysis of the results of the January 2011 G-NRUF shows that NPAs 306 and 819 also meet some of the criteria identified in section 8.1 and, consequently, the CNA is now declaring that these NPAs are also in a Jeopardy Condition.

In accordance with section 8.2 of the Canadian NPA Relief Planning Guideline and section 3, item 3 of the Canadian Numbering Resource Utilization Forecast (C-NRUF) Guideline, the CNA is required to request a Jeopardy Numbering Resource Utilization Forecast (J-NRUF) once a Jeopardy Condition has been declared for a specific NPA. Subsequent J-NRUFs shall be conducted by the CNA on a quarterly basis until 3 months before relief is implemented, unless otherwise directed by the Commission.

Accordingly, the CNA is providing the attached J-NRUF forms for completion by current and prospective CO Code Holders. Due to severe time constraints, the NPA 306 J-NRUF will be due on **15 April 2011**. The NPA 204 and 819 J-NRUFs should be completed no later than **29 April 2011**.

Each CO Code Holder that holds any CO Code assignments or reservations in NPAs 204, 306 or 819 or that intends to obtain any such CO Codes by 1 January 2017 must complete the corresponding J-NRUF Worksheet.

At CSCN 89, held on 26 October 2010, the CSCN directed, on a going-forward basis, the CNA to conduct the J-NRUF using one form, however, when CO Code assignment restrictions are included in the JCP and/or directed by the CRTC two forms are required:

- 1) Form 1 - CO Code assignment restrictions are included in the JCP and/or directed by the CRTC, and
- 2) Form 2 - CO Code assignment restrictions are not included in the JCP and/or directed by the CRTC.

As the CRTC has directed the industry to implement Code Rationing for NPA 204, two worksheets will be required for the J-NRUF for NPA 204. The first J-NRUF worksheet shall be completed assuming there "are" CO Code assignment restrictions included in the JCP or ordered by the CRTC. The second J-NRUF worksheet shall be completed assuming there are "no" CO Code assignment restrictions included in the JCP or directed by the CRTC.

**Therefore all current and prospective CO Code Holders must complete the two J-NRUF worksheets for NPA 204**, contained in the attached file (filename: NPA\_204\_April\_2011\_J-NRUF\_worksheet.xls).

For Version 1 of the NPA 204 J-NRUF Worksheet, current and prospective CO Code Holders are required to provide the total quantity of assigned and reserved CO Codes assigned to them as of 1 January 2011 and 1 April 2011 as well as the total cumulative quantity of existing and future CO Codes forecast to be assigned and reserved as of the first day of each month for the next eleven months, then as of the first day of each quarter for the next three quarters, and finally as of the first day of each year from 2013 up to and including 2017.

For Version 2 of the NPA 204 J-NRUF Worksheet, current and prospective CO Code Holders are required to provide the total quantity of assigned and reserved CO Codes assigned to them as of 1 January 2011 and 1 April 2011 as well as the total cumulative quantity of existing and future CO Codes forecast to be assigned and reserved as of the first day of each quarter for the next six quarters, and then as of the first day of each year from 2013 up to and including 2017.

For the NPA 306 J-NRUF Worksheet, current and prospective CO Code Holders are required to provide the total quantity of assigned and reserved CO Codes assigned to them as of 1 January 2011 and 1 April 2011 as well as the total cumulative quantity of existing and future CO Codes forecast to be assigned and reserved as of the first day of each quarter for the next nine quarters, and then as of the first day of each year from 2014 up to and including 2017.

For the NPA 819 J-NRUF Worksheet, current and prospective CO Code Holders are required to provide the total quantity of assigned and reserved CO Codes assigned to them as of 1 January 2011 and 1 April 2011 as well as the total cumulative quantity of existing and future CO Codes forecast to be assigned and reserved as of the first day of each month for the next twelve months, then as of the first day of each quarter for the next two quarters, and finally as of the first day of each year from 2013 up to and including 2017.

All completed NPA 306 J-NRUF forms must be returned to Suresh Khare of the CNA no later than **15 April 2011**. All NPA 204 and 819 J-NRUF forms must be returned no later than **29 April 2011**. The e-mail address is:
