## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The City of Hamilton is a port city in Ontario. Hamilton has a population of 569,355 (2021). The city is approximately 45 kilometres (28 mi) southwest of Toronto in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area (GTHA).

On January 1, 2001, the current boundaries of Hamilton were created through the amalgamation of the original city with other municipalities of the Regional Municipality of Hamilton–Wentworth, Ancaster, Dundas, Flamborough, Glanbrook, and Stoney Creek

The City of Hamilton is a growing and dynamic community committed to a citizen-centered customer service culture. On November 25, 2022, The City of Hamilton's General Issues Committee (Item 5.1) Council directed Civic Administration to proceed with implementing a 311-call service, using routing exchange boundaries.

In alignment with the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) Telecom Decision 2004-71, the City of Hamilton plans to introduce 311 services for Hamilton in consultation with surrounding jurisdictions as the non-emergency number for municipal government services. The City of Hamilton intends to test and pilot the service as early as December 2023. This 311-Implementation Notice document has been prepared for distribution via email to the telecommunication providers identified in *Appendix A*.

#### 2.0 SERVICE DESCRIPTION

The City of Hamilton uses an IP-based Automated Call Distribution (ACD) system to manage incoming calls. The system queues and distributes calls to ensure efficient handling. The contact center operates from two locations to ensure business continuity in case of power outages or building evacuations. Calls can be diverted to a SIP portal in case of extended outages.

The 311 number will be the main point of contact for non-emergency city services. The City has prioritized providing valued and sustainable services to its residents and implementing the 311 system is in line with this objective. The system has well-established service levels, call management and transfer protocols, and a comprehensive knowledge base system to ensure a seamless introduction to the 311 phone number.

The City of Hamilton provides 24/7/365 service to callers. However, the services offered may vary depending on the time of day.

During regular business hours, Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm (excluding holidays and closure), callers of 311 will hear a brief recording with Interactive Voice Response (IVR) options to direct them accordingly. The customer contact centre can help with general inquiries about all city services and guide callers to the appropriate department if needed. Thanks to the successful completion of a call consolidation project, the centre now provides First Contact Resolution (FCR) for the following areas: Public Health, Property Tax, Water, Forestry, Facilities, Transit and Waste.

Outside of regular business hours, the customer contact centre responds to non-911 municipal emergencies. Callers will hear a short greeting and unique IVR options based on services provided during this timeframe.

The city's main phone number, (905) 546-CITY (2489), will remain unchanged. The implementation plan includes IT resourcing to manage, test and soft launch the 311 number, while existing business processes, systems and toolsets will effectively support the 311 phone service.

#### 3.0 PROPOSED SERVICE AREA

The proposed service area is the City of Hamilton boundary as shown in Appendix B. The Bell Canada wire telecommunications service exchange boundaries for the City of Hamilton are shown in Appendix C.

It is recognized that the Hamilton municipal boundary does not align with the wire telecommunications service exchange boundaries. The City of Hamilton is committed to working with affected jurisdictions to ensure that callers who erroneously contact the Hamilton-311 number with be transferred back to the appropriate jurisdiction.

#### 5.0 CALL VOLUME ESTIMATES

Based on 2021 census data, 729,560 people live in the City of Hamilton making it the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest city in Ontario and the 9<sup>th</sup> largest in Canada. The city's customer contact centre receives between 500,000 and 700,000 calls per year from the public seeking information and/or services.

All stakeholders will be educated through an effective communication plan about the launch of the 311 number for Hamilton.

#### 6.0 EXPECTATIONS OF TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICE PROVIDERS

It is expected that all telecommunication service providers (TSPs) route local 311 calls to the City of Hamilton to a 10-digit number. The ten-digit number is (905) 546-2489 and will terminate at the City of Hamilton's Customer Contact Centre.



## **CITY OF HAMILTON BOUNDARY MAP**




## City of Hamilton and Connecting Municipalities
